


1. *Stitchin and Pullin'*. A story about the history of Gee's Bend location in Boykin, Alabama off the Alabama River in Wilcox County.


- Students will create their own quilt using shapes and designs with construction paper. We will then add all the patches together to create one big quilt.




2. Abuela's Weave. Campers will hear this story about Esperanza and her grandmother on the Guatemalan tradition in weaving.

- Campers will weave a large mat out of colorful construction paper.



- Campers will make a Japanese Carp Windsock.




In this cheerful book first published in China, readers are invited along with Zhao Di and her friends as they experience all the joy and excitement of this folk Chinese custom.
